## PRESIDENT'S CORNER

**Greetings Everyone!** 

The month of June is going to be the busiest month of the year for our club. Field Day is our biggest yearly club event. Plans are to set antennas up on the morning of June 23. Final preparations will be done the morning of June 24, with radio operations starting at 1100 hrs. Ops will continue throughout the afternoon and may continue overnight depending on interest and attendance. Takedown of equipment and cleanup is scheduled for the morning on June 25. If you are planning to attend, please be aware of the following guidelines:

No personal antennas, radios, power stations, or generators will be allowed on site. This is being done in order to minimize any interference between the stations we have planned to operate. You will need your own folding chair, headphones, and Morse key if needed. Please remember that Field Day is an exercise, not a contest. Our focus will be to get everyone on the radio that would like to operate with special emphasis on new hams. Please do not stand around the operating areas to socialize. Take your conversations to another area where voices do not disturb folks trying to operate.

Plans have been made to provide food throughout the day for those that would like to partake. Breakfast will be coffee and pastries. Lunch will be sandwiches, chips, fruit, and cookies. Dinner will be raviolis, salad, bread, and desert, catered by DaVinci's. Cost of the all-day meal plan is \$15 per member, \$23 per non-member. The meal plan is only available on a paid-in-advance basis and reservations are not refundable if you do not show up. No payments for the meal plan will be taken at the door. Payment for the meal plan can be taken care of in person at the upcoming meeting on June 1st, or online via the club payment portal (<a href="https://lodiarc.square.site">https://lodiarc.square.site</a>). Water will be available throughout the day and will be provided by the club. As in the past,

we will be conducting a large drawing after dinner for some very nice prizes!

Our next meeting on June 1st will feature final planning and discussions regarding Field Day. We will also discuss planning for Museum Day at Micke Grove Park which will fall during the weekend prior to Field Day this year. There are no presentations planned for the May 1st meeting due to the discussions we will be having. If you are planning to attend either the Museum Day or Field Day events, you will want to attend our next meeting to get all the latest information. We will be asking for volunteers to assist in setup, takedown, and operations, at both events. I will hope to see many of you at Casa Flores Restaurant on 6-1-23 at 1830 hrs. for the meeting.

The meeting starts promptly at 6:30. If you plan to eat dinner then arrive early as usual. We do plan to have a drawing so bring your piggy banks!!


