SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY ARES

Hello all -

I sit here and know of the swift approach of winter and the storms and fog which come with its arrival.

This is not only ARES stuff, but general for everyone.

This last fall we had two Simulated Emergency Exercises (SETs). The reason we have these drills is to discover what we need to do better in emergency conditions. The major take away from the two drill was when reporting, we need to do a better job of our location.

The best way is using at least a 4 decimal place Latitude and Longitude. For example the format is ##.#### by -###.###. There are both applications for iOS and Android phones. For iOS I use the Maidenhead app. Because it can give you the 4 Decimal places and does Maidenhead location to five parts. LL##ll##ll

Wikipedia has a good explanation, and using the different types of location formats is more than I want to cover in a newsletter. It makes a good set of three 10-minute presentations.

Now the newest fad among location schemes is called "What Three Words" often seen written as W3W. Every three-square meters on the globe has been defined as Three Words. Two examples:

- 1. The handicap parking space at the Stockon Sailing club is: //tolls.starts.stump
- 2. Casa Flores' new outdoor dining area in Lodi is: ///scarcely.cooks.vibrate

Problems have surfaced and the rush to embrace this system has slowed down. Individual accents often make the words hard to understand the W₃W. For the Stockton Sailing Club for example could be misheard as ///trolls.starts.stump, which is in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean between Spain and Nova Scotia.

I suspect there is no fool proof system of giving your location. That is one reason our cell phone uses two systems. A GPS signal from at least 4 satellites and triangulation from the cell towers. Modern 911 call centers use the data from your cell phone to get your location. For a check they usually want to give your location in the form of "on Road X between Points Y and Zed". This gives the Call Center Operators information to give the first responders a set of cross streets.
