FROM THE NET DIRECTOR & SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY ARES E.C.

Hello everyone,

This is where you usually see remarks from the Lodi ARC's Net Director. Allow me to switch hats and put on my ARRL's appointed Emergency Coordinators hat first.

This is summer; Expect hot and dry weather. Some places (usually the east side of the valley) will get summer thunderstorms and the chance of lightning strikes will grow. These lightning strikes have been known to cause wildfires; in fact we currently have one such fire burning outside of Fresno. After a thunderstorm (and if you have had nearby strikes), be on the lookout for fire and smoke.

One question often asked: When do I call 911 and report an incident? The answer is defined by looking at the word "Emergency", which is: An immediate chance of loss of life or property. Once you grasp the meaning, you should know when to call 911.

- 1) Fire is an emergency
 - You see smoke from an unknown source? That might be a priority, information which is timely in nature. It could also be an emergency. I would err on the safe side.
- 2) Observation
 - You observe a trailer being towed and a chain dragging, and sparks being thrown. This could fit either as a priority or emergency. Use your judgment. I am sure that the local fire department or CalFire would rather make a patrol of the area rather than fight a 10-20 acre or more fire.



A recent set of fires along a rural road all downwind happened a few weeks ago. The road leads to a dump site. Odds this set of small fires was started by dragging chains on a trailer. The results were three fires a few miles apart, each about 20 acres each.

One of the most useful things in the old phone book was the telephone numbers of various Public Agencies. I have a file on both my laptop and phone with non-emergency numbers. Those care where the information is important (urgent) but not an Emergency.

Knowledge is Power!

That web site has been improved in the last year. It now shows helicopters, tankers and observations flights. I was surprised at how many flights were in the air and how aggressive CalFire has been during this fire season.

Note: Not all counties have been zone mapped. In that case evacuation areas are usually designated as areas between roads. The ones I see locally during or after a heavy rain is east of Lehman Road south of Linne Road and west of Bird Road.

Now back to the normal Net Director stuff.

I am looking for one of two more net control operators to add to the rotation. Either temporary or permanent. Maybe you would like to stand in only occasionally when the Net Control Op is on vacation. I can accommodate that. If you just want the experience once, I am happy to do 1 on 1 coaching for you.

New Hams: If you want to get to know people on the radio better, become a net control operator. This allows them to learn your voice and get to know you a little too. Drop me an Email or talk to me about it at a meeting.

Note: You become a list member of the net after checking in **3 times in a row**. You could move up the roster by checking-in, while missing a net and not checking-in could move you down the roster.

We are halfway through the year, and the total check-ins at the end of June are 1,065 for the Repeater net and 772 for the Simplex net. Operators continue to improve their stations and it shows in the signal reports.

For a fun exercise, maybe we could have everyone note who they can hear and how strong their signal is (or the fact you can or can't hear them at all). I can make up an abbreviated list of known check-ins. With a little work, it might make a good presentation.
